



AIR POLLUTION

Southeast Asia does have among the worst air pollution in the world, only behind East Asia and India. The region is prone to relatively frequent “hazes,” which are the result of

widespread

fires. These fires are generally started intentionally by either small-scale farmers or companies trying to clear land of trees so they can exploit it the following year.

DEFORESTATION

In Southeast Asia specifically, given its position in the tropics, much of the forest that's destroyed is rainforest, one of the most biologically diverse ecosystems on the planet. Rainforests are not only home to more than half of the world's plant and animal species, but they also provide over a quarter of our natural medicines, and they absorb over a quarter of our planet's carbon dioxide.

RAPID URBANIZATION

Main urban cities are being projected as major and industrial cities of the nation but on the other hand pollution-related diseases in these cities are on the rise due to intolerable levels of air and noise pollution in the city. Some 35 percent of people are affected by ailments including cardiac, lung, ENT, skin, eye and psychological diseases. • According to estimates, over 1.43 million vehicles are plying on the city's roads and the number is growing continuously as more than 300 vehicles are being registered in the main cities every day.


